SUBJECT: Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month – April 2024

SUBJECT: Denim Day Observance

- 1. The Department of Defense (DOD) and the U.S. Army observe Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month (SAAPM) each April with events that reaffirm our commitment to eliminate sexual assault and sexual harassment. Denim Day is an internationally recognized SAAPM event, which supports the month's objective of increasing awareness and outreach by encouraging people to wear denim. Wearing denim on this day is a visible means of protest the misconceptions that surround sexual violence and expresses support for sexual assault survivors.
- 2. The Denim Day Observance began in Italy after a 1999 Italian Supreme Court decision overturned a 1992 rape conviction based on the victim's clothing. The Justices argued that, because the woman was wearing tight jeans, she must have given consent. This decision led to protests where women wore jeans showing support for the victim. The protests quickly spread, and in April 1999, a Los Angeles social service agency established the first U.S. Denim Day.
- 3. The 2024 Denim Day observance will occur Wednesday, 24 April 2024. In accordance with AR 670-1, 3-7a, Commanders of ACOMS/ASCC/DRUs, Heads of DA Staff agencies, and HQDA principal officials may authorize military personnel to participate in this event.
- 4. If approved by one of the appropriate authorities, the wearing of denim must be voluntary, and the significance of wearing denim must be clearly conveyed. Participants must wear appropriate attire: no ripped, torn, cut offs, or jeans worn below the waist. In accordance with AR 670-1, 3-9c "when civilian clothing is worn, Soldiers will ensure that their dress and personal appearance are commensurate with the high standards traditionally associated with Army service. The wearing of denim will serve as a sign of the participant's commitment to establishing a climate of dignity and respect and support to survivors.
